Weather Monday: high 53, low 39, rain .08. Rain at 7 a.m. Tuesday was .43. The sun popped out about noon, but it was still on the chilly side.

Six Ku Klux Klansmen and Nazis were acquitted Monday of murder and rioting charges in the deaths of five communists in Greensboro. The all-white Guilford County jury returned the verdicts after 6½ days of deliberation, ending a 23-week trial, the longest ever in the state.

N. C. Officials Monday approved construction of the state's first hazardous waste treatment and recycling plant 10 miles south of downtown Charlotte. The plant will neutralize or burn textile dyes, pesticides, herbicides and other liquid chemical wastes from industries up to 150 miles from Mecklenburg County. It will not treat such materials as radioactive waste and polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs).

A snow storm left West Texas and Oklahoma mired in a snow a foot deep Monday, and left traffic paralyzed and schools closed before it headed east into Pennsylvania and the Appalachian Mountains. Up to 17

## Landrum Plant To Expand

Jack Elliott, President of South Carolina Elastic Company announced the start of construction of an addition to the plant. South Carolina Elastic Company manufactures a wide variety of elastic narrow fabrics used in outerwear and underwear, mostly waistbands. The original plant was built in 1954 and began production of braided elastics in 1955. Since then the plant has been expanded six times. The last expansion was completed in 1978. This seventh expansion will probably be the last because there isn't any more land available at the Landrum location.

In deciding to build at this time when business isn't very strong, Mr. Elliott said, we are looking beyond the recession and preparing to take care of needs that we anticipate in the next few years. This indicates our basic faith in the future of the textile industry and in the economy of the Carolinas. The installation of new machinery will take about 18 months after the building is complete. It is scheduled to be completed by October 1982 or sooner by which time employment will have increased by about 10% adding more new jobs to this part of the state.
