Knowlton of the Lanier Library Board has announced according to an ad that on Sat., Dec. 6 from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. there will be a sale of books in the Library located at the corner of Chestnut St. and Melrose Ave. in Tryon. Approximately 500 books will be for sale at prices ranging from 10 cents to 75 cents. Included will be novels, mysteries, biographies, childrens' books and more.

Like all libraries, big and small, the Lanier Library has acquired more books than it can shelve or store in its building. The Library Board has appointed a Book Disposition Committee of Mrs. Franklin Basler, Chairman, Mrs. G. Freeman Brooks and Mrs. Mildred Turnbull. The Committee selects for disposition: books in which there is little interest as revealed by lack of circulation; extra copies of books; when there are several books by a single author, only those are kept that are highly rated by the "Fiction Catalog", finally, disposal is made of books in which the paper has turned brown due to the chemicals used in paper manufacture-often a deteriorated book has been replaced by one in better condition.

The sale on December 6 will be supervised by the Library Renovation Committee of Mrs. Harold D. White, Chairman, George S. Stothoff, Mrs. Sidney H. Morgan and Frank Johnson.
