Miss Estes, a graduate of the College of the Ozarks in Clarksville, Ark., earned a B. A. degree in Speech and Drama, and graduated Magna Cum Laude, and was voted the outstanding senior woman. She was listed in "Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities", and was president of the college players.

Following graduation, she taught high school speech and English for two years in Louisville, Ky. and Jeffersonville, Ind. In 1969 she joined TV station WLKY-TV in Louisville doing the "Romper Room" show as well as some news and public affairs.
