Weather Tuesday: high 60, low 32. Wednesday was another beautiful spring day.

Despite moderating food prices, a huge jump in gasoline and fuel oil rates pushed the nation's cost of living up last month at an annual rate of 12.1 percent, the government said Tuesday.

Wednesday's Spartanburg Herald had a story about a fishing outing by Paul Rollins and Paul Hicks which turned into a cold night on an island in Lake Moultrie. Mr. Rollins is an attorney with offices in Landrum and Spartanburg. Rollin's bass fishing boat took on water Sunday morning, forcing the two men into the cold water.
