Weather Wednesday: high 71, low 39. Thursday morning brought some much needed rain.

Astronauts John Young and Robert Crippen were scheduled to have been launched into space this morning if all went well. They will be aboard the first ship created to make space travel as routine as an overseas airline flight. Because it is a test of machinery, their mission will be considered a near-success if they make it up and down again safely.

Gen. Omar N. Bradley, who led a million U. S. soldiers in World War II and was the nation's last five-star general, died Wednesday at the age of 88 in New York. He was also the nation's first chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

Nuclear power costs, plagued by high construction costs and safety shutdowns after the 1979 Three Mile Island accident, exceeded those from newer coal plants.
