Big Chase

The Town of Landrum had lots of excitement Tuesday afternoon when three police cars were in pursuit of another vehicle. The chase started in Tryon when Tryon Police Officer Billy Stepp tried to stop a car driven by John Calvin Bailey of Rt. 1, Landrum on Screvin Road. The car didn't stop and headed down River Road. The Tryon Police called for assistance from the Sheriff's Dept. and Sheriff Boyce Carswell tried to head the car off near Comoco Farm, but arrived seconds late. He joined in the chase in the event of an accident or if help were needed. The Landrum Police had been notified and they tried to stop the car near the state line.

Apparently Bailey tried to make the turn off Rutherford Road to Shamrock and hit the curb in front of the Landrum Landromat. Bailey was taken from his car and handcuffed.

Spartanburg County had a warrant for his arrest for Criminal Sexual Assault. Tryon Police have a warrant for him for failing to stop for blue light and siren. Landrum Police took out a warrant for him for violation of the S.C. gun law (had a gun on the front seat of the car). He was taken to the Spartanburg County Jail.
