District 1 Board Approves Budget

The District One School Board approved the 1981-82 budget Tuesday, which will be presented to the Spartanburg County School Board June 16.

The new budget increased from \$5,309,170 to \$5,978,651. Property evaluation dropped from \$13,574,222 to \$13,465,811.

To finance its renovation of Chapman High School, the Board sold \$600,000 in bonds May 26 at 10.17 percent interest rate. The board will receive bids June 18 at 3 p.m., bids in the district office conference room for the renovation room. — Spartanburg Herald
