The N C House of Representatives gave tentative approval Wednesday to a constitutional amendment giving state legislators longer terms. Because the Senate already has approved the measure, final House approval would put the amendment before the voters. With a three-fifths majority of 72 votes needed to pass, the House voted 77 to 38 to approve an amendment doubling legislators' terms from two years to four years.

## Town Of Lynn

Bill Dobbyn, loca correspondent for the Asheville Citizen had an article in Thursday's paper that some 60 to 70 citizens of Lynn met Monday night at the Pacolet Baptist Church to begin procedures that would lead to the reincorporation of the Town of Lynn.

A temporary slate of town officers are Phillip A. Pleasants. mayor; Norman Foster, Bill Wilson and Mrs. Mike (Georgia) Burrell as council members, and Mrs. Bob (Peggy) Constance as clerk.

Mr. Pleasants is quoted as saying that Lynn citizens felt they were being threatened by the proposed annexation by Tryon, and the already accomplished annexation of Columbus in a direction toward Lynn on Hwy. 108. Additionally, he said, his point of view coincided with that of others that there was entirely too much government.

"What we want", he said, "is the original boundaries of Lynn.'

The group has decided to establish the old boundaries of Lynn which extended ½ mile east and west of the bridge over Pacolet River and 1/2 mile north and south of the bridge over Pacolet. These boundaries were disolved in 1965 by a legislative act after the town government had been non-existent for many
