Israeli planes streaking 600 miles into hostile territory destroyed an almost completed Iraqi nuclear reactor outside Baghdad, a facility Israel claimed would have made atomic bombs for use against the Jewish state. The attack, made Sunday, was not released until Monday. The startling Israeli operation was condemned in Washington, as well as in Arab and other Western capitals.
