The Reagan administration formally declared Thursday it would sell arms to friendly countries without looking too closely at their human rights policies. The new guideline dumps former President Carter's rule against weapons deliveries to countries with a record of citizen abuse. "We will deal with the world as it is, rather than as we would like it to be" an administration statement said.
