22 Arrested; 12 Cars Confiscated; In Drug Raids

Friday law enforcement officers arrested 22 persons in Polk Rutherford and Spartanburg counties on drug related charges. Sheriff Boyce Carswell stated Monday morning that one more arrest was expected. A total of 12 vehicles were seized in the three county operation.
