Question: I dropped by our local hunting and fishing license agent's place of business last week to renew my license but was told that the 1981-82 hunting-fishing licenses hadn't come in yet. What am I to do? My old license has expired, the new ones aren't available and I want to go fishing!

Answer: Due to a delay in printing and delivery, license agents across the state will not receive their consignments of 1981-82 licenses until around August 20th. For that reason the validity of your 1980-81 license has been extended until September 1, 1981. If you do not have a 1980-81 license but would like to go fishing before the new licenses become available, call the Wildlife Resources Commission's Division of
