Weather Monday: high 83, low 70, humidity 72%. Tuesday morning was cloudy and cool but no rain by noon.

Sidestepping judgment of recent Israeli bombing raids on two foreign countries, Secretary of State Alexander M. Haig, Jr. said Monday the U. S. will resume shipment of sophisticated warplanes to Israel.
