U. S. Navy pilots on patrol off the coast of Libya had no choice but to shoot down two Libyan fighters attacking them and will react the same way in the future, Secretary of Defense Caspar Weinberger said Wednesday. "If we had failed to act, our own aircraft, exercising legally in international waters might well have been shot down.

The national economy jolted into reverse in the spring quarter, declining even faster than first thought the Commerce Department reported Wednesday. The gross national product fell at a rate of 2.4 percent in the April — June period.

Britain's Sebastian Coe regained the world record for the mile Wednesday night with a time of 3 minutes 48.53 seconds at the Zurich invitational track and field meet. Earlier, Renaldo Nehemiah of the United States broke his own world record in the 110-meter hurdles with a time of 12.93, becoming the first ever to accomplish the feat in less than 13 seconds.
