Iranian parents have been warned to "watch their children closely" because even 12 year olds would be executed for demonstrating against the regime, a Tehran newspaper said Sunday. 149 leftist insurgents were put to death over the weekend.

Secretary of State Alexander M. Haig, Jr. said Sunday he will tell Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko the Reagan administration is "ready to talk seriously" with the Soviets but that they must not intervene in Poland.

## Management Buys Bigelow From Sperry And Hutchinson

A group of senior managers at Bigelow-Sanford have purchased the company from its current owner, Sperry and Hutchinson of New York.

Operations of the Bigelow plant in Landrum are not affected by the move, according to Iain MacDonald, Plant Manager.

In Greenville, S. C., at Bigelow headquarters, C. R. Goulet, Chairman of the company, said: "Bigelow's organization, management group, character and goals will remain unchanged. Over the past five years, Bigelow has been one of the most successful and profitable companies in the carpet industry."

Bigelow is one of the five largest carpet companies in the U. S., with sales of approximately \$200 million. It has 3,000 employees, with about 400 located at the plant here.

Founded in 1825, Bigelow has long enjoyed a reputation as a maker of high quality carpets for residential, commercial and institutional use. In recent years, it has become a technological, design and style leader as well.

In 1980, Goulet said, the company made its largest capital expenditures since 1973 to install state-of-the-art machinery for beaming, slashing, weaving and
