Weather Wednesday: high 80, low 47, humidity 23%. Thursday was another beautiful day.

The U. S. Postal Service, overruling the independent Postal Rate Commission for the first time, announced Wednesday it will raise rates for a first-class letter by 2 cents to 20 cents. The new rate will take effect Nov. 1st. The Postal Service also raised rates of post cards from 12 cents to 13 cents and imposes rate hikes throughout most of the postal schedule. The new rate was immediately challenged in the courts by the National Association of Greeting Card Publishers whose members will be hit especially hard because the increase comes just before the Christmas mailing season.

If federal income taxes are withheld from your paycheck, you can expect a modest increase in take-home pay, thanks to the first installment of President Reagan's three year 25% tax reduction for individuals. Most of us won't be able to tell much difference until the next step becomes effective.
