Egypt's defense minister Wednesday said an "isolated" group of four men led by a Moslem extremist assassinated Anwar Sadat Tuesday at a suburban Cairo parade ground.

Secretary of State Alexander Haig warned "external powers" Wednesday to stay out of Egyptian politics in the wake of President Anwar Sadat's death.

Sam Brown, the 14-year-old boy who was Anwar Sadat's guest two years ago will attend the funeral of the Egyptian president as a member of the official United States delegation. Sam, who lives in Liberty, S. C. will be on the plane with former presidents Carter, Ford and Nixon.

Tryon Police Chief Jerry Ross reported that Bobby Carson, age 40 of 211 Peake Street, Tryon, died Wednesday night at St. Luke's Hospital from gunshot wounds. Chief Ross stated that Mr. Carson was shot in the midsection with a 12 gauge shotgun, about 9:45 p.m. Wednesday.

Being held for his murder is a brother, Billy Carson, age 39, also of 211 Peake Street. Chief Ross said that the brothers reportedly got into an argument before the shooting occurred.
