James R. Ambrose was nominated by President Reagan to be Under Secretary of the Army on September 30, 1981, was confirmed by the United States Senate on October 7, 1981. As one of the Army's top civilians, he will assist in formulating overall Army policy, procedures and programs.

Mr. Ambrose was born in Brewer, Maine, on August 16, 1922. He was educated through high school in Bangor, and graduated with high distinction and departmental honors from the University of Maine in 1943 with a degree in engineering physics. Later he attended Georgetown University, Catholic University, and the University of Maryland where he acquired a substantial part of his post
