Election Tomorrow

The municipal elections in Columbus, Landrum, Saluda and Tryon will be held tomorrow.

In Columbus Ted Owens is unopposed for mayor. In the Council race (vote for two) there are incumbents Harry Denton and Mary Hicks along with Pat Wilson.

Landrum is the town with lots of Candidates. For Mayor there is incumbent Dever Little and former Mayor Robert Cogdell. In the council race (two to be elected) there are incumbent Ray Mayfield, incumbent; Gerald Barnette, Mike Carruth, Bill Hill, Edmund Komant, Alford Mullins and Robert Turner.
