Weather Tuesday: high 40, low 34, hum. 80% and the rain at 6 a.m. Wednesday was 1.30 inches. After the rain had cleared the air, Wednesday morning was sunny and clear — a beautiful morning.

It's official. Clemson was named the No. 1 football team in the nation.

The Justice Department absolved Richard V. Allen on Tuesday of any wrongdoing in his receipt of \$1,000 from Japanese journalists but said it was still investigating other questions about the president's national security advisor.

Budget director David A. Stockman wants to end federal subsidies for low-income housing construction by next fall as part of spending cuts that has left housing officials in shock. He is also proposing to phase out the government's chief urban aid programs.

The U. S. Justice Department disapproved Tuesday a 13-year-old North Carolina state constitutional amendment, saying it had led to the dilution of black voting strength in legislative districts. The 1968 amendment, approved by the state's voters, added two provisions to the state
