Two Wrecks

Highway Patrolman C. T. "Butch" Kennedy investigated two single vehicle accidents Tuesday morning.

At 6:45 a.m. Rhonda Thompson of Rt. 2, Mill Spring, driving a 1982 AMC vehicle wrecked on Silver Creek Road near Sam Searcy's cloth shop.
