## Young Girl Seriously Injured

Michelle Blackwell, 13 year old daughter of Donald Dean Blackwell of Rt. 2, Mill Spring was seriously burned and injured Thursday afternoon by a 44,000 volt transmission line on Blackwell Road, Rt. 2, Mill Spring.

According to reports, the Blackwell girl and a boy were daring each other to climb the Duke Power Transmission Tower. Michelle climbed about 46 feet up the tower to the insulator. At this point she was knocked off the tower by the voltage and seriously burned. Either the fire from her clothing or sparks from the power line started a grass fire.

She was taken to St. Luke's Hospital where she was treated and transferred to the Burn Center at the N. C. Baptist Hospital in Winston-Salem, where she was listed in critical condition Friday morning.
