Bobbi, who is a student in Mrs. Blanton's fifth grade at Stearns Elementary School in Columbus, and daughter of Robert and Marilyn Wilson of Skyuka Road, won the title at the State Championship Meet held in Spartanburg, S. C. on March 26 through 28.

As a member of the Spartanburg Swim Club team, Bobbi competed against other girls in her age group from the twelve top teams throughout the State. She won gold medals for the 50 yard and 100 yard freestyle races, and a gold medal for the 100 yard breaststroke race.
