Council Passes

Annexation Ordinance

The Tryon Town Council met Monday, April 5th for the purpose of considering the Annexation Ordinance. Mayor Ken Tucker requested Town Attorney Vance McCown to read the Annexation Ordinance. Upon completion of his reading the ordinance, Councilman Ellis Fincher moved that the annexation ordinance be adopted, this was seconded by Councilman Herbert 1.66 Rickenbacker, Jr. and passed unanimously.

The effective date of the Annexation is June 1, 1982. At this time all the services provided by the Town will be extended to the newly annexed areas, pending judicial review by the N. C. Superior Court if petitioned by those in opposition.

The regular meeting of the Town Council will be Monday, April 12th at 7:30 p.m.
