U. S. Secretary of State Alexander M. Haig, Jr. said after 11½ hours of talks Monday with British leaders that "time is slipping away from us" in averting a South Atlantic war between Britain and Argentina over the Falkland Islands.

Gov. Jim Hunt has agreed to meet with executives of Duke Power Co. and Carolina Power & Light Co. to discuss Hunt's plans to ask the Legislature to repeal or modify a state law that allows utilities to pass on increases in fuel costs to their customers.
