A sharply divided Supreme Court on Wednesday limited federal judges' power to stamp out civil rights violations, overturning fines against Yonkers, N.Y., councilmen who blocked a housing desegregation plan. The vote was 5-4.

The Columbia astronauts put a Navy communications satellite into orbit Wednesday and continued to close in on the path of a floating science laboratory they hope to snatch from space.

Premier Li Peng lifted Beijing's 7 month old martial law Wednesday night and said that by crushing pro-democracy protests, the army had saved China from "the abyssis of misery."
