The weather Thursday was sunny, a great relief from two days of overcast and downpours. The high was 52, low 46. Hum. 85%. At 7 a.m. Friday, 31 inches of rain had fallen.

The Dow Jones industrial average went down more than 40 points on Thursday, reaching its lowest point in six months.
