Japan's conservative governing party fought off criticism about scandals and an unpopular tax and held onto its majority in parliament's powerful lower house, officials returns showed Monday.

Demonstrators yelling "Down With Communism" smashed their way into interim government headquarters in Bucharest, Romania. They used rocks and iron rods Sunday in the most violent protest since the December pro-democracy revolution.

Ariel Sharon, Israel's best-known hawk, formally quit the government Sunday, saying he resigned because he feared the government's peace plan could lead to war. He is expected to seek to become prime minister.

## Super 10 Store Closes Its Doors

The Super 10 store in Tryon Plaza closed its doors Thursday night for the last time.

The variety store, which boasted that nothing it sold cost over \$10, carried clothing, housewares, stationery supplies, automotive goods, and paper goods.

The public relations officer for the parent company, Variety Wholesalers of Raleigh, was unavailable for comment Monday. There are approximately 400 Super 10 stores nationwide.

Garrett & Garrett of Fountain Inn, S.C., a firm which owns and manages properties in North Carolina, South Carolina and Georgia, is the owner of Tryon Plaza.

Blake Garrett, Jr. said Monday that he was unaware that Super 10 had closed its doors, but expected that the company would notify him soon.

Garrett said often a chain like Variety Wholesalers will reopen a sister store in the same space where they've closed a store. He said it is also possible his firm will aid the Super 10 owners in finding a new tenant for the space.

"The Tryon Plaza is not new," Garrett said. "Although we've spent plenty of money to keep it upgraded. From time to time shopping centers do go through a transition, from a basics center to specialty shops. It could be
