A surprise in Nicaragua, Violeta Barrios de Chamorro of the United National Opposition apparently defeated Daniel Ortega, which will end the 10-year rule of the leftist Sandinistas.

Saying politics is "too brutal for me," Gov. Jim Martin has vowed not to run for any elected office once his term ends in 1992. Martin, in a letter to The News and Observer of Raleigh published Sunday, said he was embittered by what he viewed as unfair, partisan attacks by Democrats.

"It takes a little while to come up with that kind of tenant," he said.
