An American educator held for three and a half years as a hostage in Beirut was released Monday afternoon, according to CBS News reports. A group calling itself the Organization of Islamic Dawn delivered an announcment Sunday to an independent Beirut newspaper saying Frank Reed would soon be freed.

Reed, 57, of Malden, Mass., is married to a Syrian Muslim woman. He was running the private Lebanese International School at the time of his abduction.
