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Saluda Adopts Water Policy

Saluda City council adopted a policy Tuesday that explains the conditions under which the city will provide water and sewer services and street maintenance for residents of Saluda subdivisions.

"We have never had an ordinance of this nature," Mayor Nolan Pace said Friday. "Of course, we are anticipating some growth, and we'd like to have orderly growth and place the responsibility where it should

The 112-page policy, which want into effect immediately after its adoption, states that Saluda will provide water and sewer services to subidivions within its city limits when it is "within the best interest of the city and the property owners."

The policy also states that the city will maintain water and sewer systems within city subdivision developer systems are built to standards set by the city.

The city will not agree to maintain any subdivision's water or sewer system that is not complete, not in working order and not built to the city's standards, the policy states.

Likewise, the city will not agree to maintain any city subdivision's streets unless the subdivision's entire street system is established, paved and built to the city's standards.
