Dr. Rozema received a medal of appreciation from the Charles University School of Medicine for continued support and participation in the field of Chelation Medicine.

Dr. Rozema has been a leader in this field, creating the International Chelation Research Foundation which is now sponsoring a scientific study of EDTA for use in peripheral vascular disease at Walter Reed and Letterman Army Hospitals.
