The Spartanburg NAACP filed a complaint Thursday with the FBI in Washington, D. C. condemning the handling of an investigation into claims of illegal wiretapping at the Landrum Police Department.

The FBI concluded that no federal law was violated in the wiretapping incident.

"We feel a thorough, unbiased, professional FBI investigation will reveal that Police Chief Edwards and other policemen had their conversations recorded without their knowledge by an electronic, hidden device, which is illegal, and it is not being done by other police departments in our state under the guise of monitoring emergency calls," said Roy Henderson, president of the Spartanburg NAACP.
