The weekend weather: Friday, high 86, low 65, hum. 68 percent, and .26 inches of rain fell; Saturday, high 91, low 64, hum. 73 percent; Sunday, high 89, low 71, hum. 70 percent. As of 7 a.m. Monday, .43 inches of rain had fallen.

Spartanburg County voters will elect County Council members from individual districts in the general election next May. The single member district system was approved by voters in a March 13 referendum and was given final approval by the County Council last week.

Quentin Anderson, public relations director for the AAA Carolina Motor Club recommended that motorists watch the prices they are paying at the gas pumps. Some gas stations have jumped prices as much as ten cents in recent days.

"We recommend that motorists.... boycott the stations that jumped their prices," Anderson said.

Some price rises were predicted because of U.S. sanctions halting the flow of 610,000 barrels of Iraqi oil per day.
