The Asheville Citizen reported Thursday that interim county manager Glenn Rhodes now believes the county and Alltel will settle their differences amicably.

The Shady Grove Band has appeared at many of the largest music festivals in the US, Canada and Europe. They have toured Europe on six months-long concert tours and still maintained a busy college touring schedule throughout this country. Four times selected for the NC Arts Council Touring program, the band was recently selected for the Southern Arts Federation roster through 1991.

The band is an ideal group for such an event as the Summer Social, delivering a high energy show with a concentration on humor and a good time for the audience. Their reviews of performances, whether in this country, Canada or Europe, invariably end with fans noisily
