"David was beginning to excel after his first season along the defensive line before injuring his knee during spring drills... A hard-working player, he reeled the work during spring drills to gain experience and challenge

for playing time... Played offensive guard for the first two seasons of his Wolfpack career... Joined the Pack following an outstanding career in high school... A four-year starter at defensive

end and tight end for Coach Elmo Neal at Tryon High School... Defensively, he recorded 120 tackles along with six fumble recoveries and a pair of blocked punts as a senior... Also had 25 catches for over 500 yards and two touchdowns... Named the

squad's most valuable lineman in 1986... An honorable mention all-Western North Carolina selection, he also maintained a 3.8 grade point average... Tallied 16 points and 10 rebounds per game for the basketball team... Enrolled in political science with his eye on law school... Born on September 17, 1968.
