

Hospital Trustees Set \$5 Million Goal

St. Luke's Hospital's trustees have established goals and objectives for next fiscal year. which begins Oct. 1. The primary goal set by the board is to raise \$2 million over the next three years for the endowment fund, raising the total endowment to \$5 million.

Interest and dividend income from the endowment fund is used to support hospital operations, maintain the physical plant, and purchase capital equipment. The trustees have begun initial planning for a formal development and fundraising program to raise the additional \$2 million needed.

Additional goals set by the board include: 1) continuing renovation programs for specific areas, including the lobby and gift shop; 2) ongoing development of programs expressly for the older population, including Case Management and Health/Wellness programs; and 3) the development of special programs directed toward the business community employers inthe area.
