Smith May Choose Next Councilman

Columbus Mayor Paul T. Smith may be called upon to choose the newest member of the Columbus Town Council tonight.

The council must appoint a member to replace Grover Hutcherson, who died recently, **Town Administrator Butch Smith** said. A special election cannot be

But the two remaining councilmen have different ideas about who should be appointed, and the mayor may have to cast the deciding vote.

Dr. Tom Bolling said he believes the replacement ought to be Kathleen McMillian since she was the next highest voter getter in the last election.

The vote totals were: Paul Smith, 266, Robert Ormand, 189, Tom Bolling, 184, Kathleen McMillian, 180, and Charles Blackwell, 148.

Robert Ormand said he intends to nominate Charles Blackwell, his running mate in the last

"He served four years (on town council) before," Ormand said. "He is a businessman in town,"

Ormand said he believes Blackwell would be good for Columbus. "We are trying to work for the betterment of the town," he said. "We are trying to get people to work together."
