Plane Crashes Outside Saluda



A Florida man was killed sometime Tuesday when his plane crashed on Pace Road, just off Green River Cove Road in Saluda.

Polk County Chief Deputy Calvin Atkins said the man has been identified as Russell Kaminsky, 43, of Englewood, Florida. He is reported to have a wife and small child.

Atkins said Kaminsky was on his way to Asheville to look at a plane he was considering buying when his plane went down. He was flying a 1962 Cessna Model 182-E, a fixed wing, single engine
