The Polk County Community Foundation awarded grants of \$96,260 last year, and approved another \$101,400.00. Disbursement of this much money by this public charitable organization is done very carefully.

The Foundation's Distribution Committee, chaired by Howard K McIntyre, takes its responsibilities very seriously.

This means that every grant request takes time and investigative persistence by members of the Distribution Committee before they make, as required, a recommendation to the full Board of Directors.

Tax exempt organizations making grant requests should get their written applications in early, to allow time for the Distribution Committee to make its study before presenting its appraisal at the quarterly Directors' meeting.

The next Distribution Committee meeting is Jan. 22. The next Directors' meeting is April 11.
