## Accident Claims Polk Co. Youth

Charles Bryan Lookadoo, 18, of Tryon, was killed instantly Wednesday afternoon in a single vehicle accident on Hwy. 108 in Rutherford County.

According to Highway Patrolman Tobey Collins, investigating officer, Lookadoo was the driver of a 1991 Chevrolet pickup truck which was traveling west on Hwy. 108 at an excessive rate of speed, lost control and crossed left striking a poplar tree. The accident occurred at approximately 3:20 p.m. about 2.3 miles west of Rutherfordton (near the old county home). No other vehicles were involved.

Jeffrey Jones, 18 and of Tryon, a passenger in the vehicle, was taken to Rutherford Hospital where he was listed in poor condition in the Intensive Care Unit. Patrolman Collins stated that Jones was transported by helicopter to Charlotte Thursday afternoon.
