Senator Lists Info On Jobs In Kuwait

On March 14, Senator Robert C. Carpenter released information which may help those interested in getting jobs or contracting business in connection with the estimated 100 billion dollar task of rebuilding war-rayaged Kuwait.

"There's been a lot of talk about the massive effort it's going to take to rebuild Kuwait, and our office has been asked by many in the district how they might become involved," Carpenter stated." The Kuwaiti government says it will favor U.S. companies as it begins its rebuilding program.

According to information received by Carpenter's office from Sen. Helm's office in Washington, the Dept. of Commerce has established the Gulf Reconstruction Center to serve as an information clearinghouse for businesses. The Center number is: 202–377–5767.
