### Sheriff's Drug **Fundraising Raises Community Concerns**

A Nashville, Tenn. firm's telemarketing fundraising campaign underway in Polk County has raised the concern of some area residents.

On behalf of the Polk County Sheriff's Department, callers have been soliciting donations of up to \$100 from businesses and individuals to help with the "Sheriff's annual drug education program."

Using a phone bank in the Century 21 Alan Pruette & Associates building in Tryon, two or three callers have been working for the last few days.

"The toll that drugs are taking from our children, the citizens of tomorrow, is a severe loss that we can no longer afford," the callers say. "In addition, 70 percent of all crimes are drug related ...

"We feel that this problem is a war and we need as many soldiers to help fight this war as possible. Our goal is to educate every man, woman and child in the county on the seriousness of drug abuse... Please open your heart and help."

Danny Watson of Concord, N.C. is the drug education program fundraising project manager. He said he has worked for the last six months as an independent contractor with Benefit Shows of Nashville.

Watson said the money raised here will be used to deliver an
