Instead of one place recycling paper, another recycling plastic and another recycling alumi-num there will be MRF's, laor material resource facilities.

At the MRF, pros will sort your garbage. Homeowners will be out of the sorting racket. It's too crucial to the processing of materials and vastly more complicated than just separating green from brown glass. The MRFs will become

"waste exchange centers" or "garbage malls" which you can visit to buy recycled office paper, facial tissue, yard mulch, remixed paint, tile and insulation.
