New Books At Lanier Library

A few of the new books in Lanier Library are the following:

NON-FICTION:

Cold Warrior, by Tom Mangold. "James Jesus Angleton, American legendary spy-catcher was the last great Cold Warrior. He was rarely photographed in public, his existence was not officially revealed until his enforced dismissal from the CIA in 1974. Only now is it clear why the agency endeavored to keep the facts about their ruthless head of counter-intelligence a closely guarded secret. This book charts Angleton's involvement in some of the most notorious counter-spionage events of the sixties and seventies."

Boss of Bosses, by Joseph F. O'Brien and Andris Kurins. "This book is subtitled *The Fall of the Godfather: The FBI and Paul Castellano*." For many years the most powerful man in all of American crime was Paul Castellano. Through the bug-ging of the Godfather's inner sanctum, the FBI learned the secrets not only of the Godfather but of the entire New York area mob. The authors of this book are both active agents with the FBI."

Three Men Of The Beagle by Richard Lee Marks. "The three men of the Beagle are Charles Darwin himself; Robert Fitz-Roy, the ship's aristocratic commander and Jemmy Button, (Continued On Back Page)
