It was like deja vu all over again. We read about Henderson County's proposed school merger plans. Consultants have recommended that the Henderson County commissioners fund the merged system at the same level as Hendersonville city schools.

City residents have been paying a supplemental tax of 16.5 cents per \$100. This enabled the city to chip in over \$1,000 per student in local funds. The county's local contribution has been about \$662 per student.

Of course, the city will no longer pay a supplemental tax if the systems are merged. In addition to making up the loss of revenue from the city's supplemental tax, the consultants recommend the county increase its local share to bring all per pupil expenditures to the city's current level.

The consultant estimates a 10-cent tax increase will be necessary.

Perhaps the federal government will see the wisdom in using the peace dividend to invest America's productive
