### **Polk Retail Sales Decrease Sharply**

TRYON, N. C. 28782

Retail sales, which have been climbing steadily in Polk County since February, dropped dramatically in September according to figures released by the N.C. Department of Revenue.

Sales and Use Tax collections for September totalled \$75,529, representing sales of \$3.7 million. That's a decrease of \$1.2 million from August sales.

Rutherford County sales dropped for the second month in a row, going from \$25.8 million in August to \$22.7 million in September.

Henderson County sales, which dipped in August, grew in \$3.3 million in September to \$43.5.
