As one of North Carolina's top high school cross country athletes, Wolverine runner Chad Lanford has been selected to participate in the Shrine Bowl Game Ball Run.

The run, a relay of the official Shrine Bowl football, will be held on Dec. 13, the day before the annual North Carolina/South Carolina all-star football game. It will begin at the Greensboro Oriental Shrine Club and will conclude at Charlotte Memorial Stadium. Each of the 33 runners will run a 2-3 mile leg of the relay.

As a Shrine Bowl Game Ball runner, Lanford will be saluted at the Shrine Bowl Awards Banquet and will receive a special warm-up jacket. He will also be a guest at the football game and may ride on the runners float in the pre-game parade.
