

#### Students, Parents **Question Policy Against Hand Holding**

Students at Polk Central and Tryon High were issued a series of behavioral guidelines this week initiated by Superintendent of Schools James Causby.

The regulations touched on behavior in three areas: "(1) Use of inappropriate language including vulgarity, cursing, obscene gestures, (2) Improper signs of affection including intimate touching, kissing, holding hands, and (3) Improper dress including revealing clothing, shirts with obscene slogans or alcohol/drug emblems, and caps with curse words or vulgarity."

Consequences for violations range from a warning coupled with parent notification to five days out-of-school suspension with a parent conference, depending on the number and severity of offenses.

Dr. Causby said he issued the new guidelines with input from the School Board because the school board had received numerous complaints from parents about inappropriate behavior among students.

"A lot of things have been going on that shouldn't be going on - kids hanging on each other, wearing inappropriate clothing and bad language." He said he felt strongly that the school is not the place for these activities and that the guidelines will be enforced both during the school day and at school ath-
