Two Murder Cases On Court Docket

There will be a full docket next week when Criminal Superior Court meets in special session in Polk County starting Monday, April 6th.

Judge Forrest Ferrell will preside over several highlypublicized cases connected with

murder charges.

James Edward Jaynes of Union Mills and Shane Michael Smith of Rutherfordton are both scheduled to be tried on charges of murder, first degree burglary and arson in connection with the 1990 death of Paul Frederick Acker.

Acker was killed and his mobile home set on fire on October 10, 1990. In connection with the same case, Daniel Charles Marr is charged with being an accessory before the fact and Wanda Carolyn Marr is charged with being an accessory after the fact.

Frankie Dean McFalls of Columbus is also scheduled to be tried on charges of murder in connection with the death of Angelia Louise Brown on October 17, 1991. McFalls confessed to the murder of his common law wife when he was arrested in January of this year.
